

## GENERIC TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THREE (3) INDIVIDUAL CONSULTANTS

Title: Data Analyses – Secondary analysis to provide a baseline on basic Sexual Reproductive Health (SRH) and family planning knowledge and attitudes amongst women, men and young people.

- To be used for multiple recruitments, one consultant per country.
- Three (3) Countries assigned: Kiribati (2024), Samoa (2024); Vanuatu (2024)

## **Hiring Office:** UNFPA Pacific Sub-Office (PSRO), Suva, Fiji Development of an analytical report to inform behavioural change strategies related Purpose of to sexual and reproductive health behaviour among youth and women. The consultancy consultant will: Using the MICS-DHS micro-data, develop a composite indicator to establish a baseline to measure Indicator 11 of their Transformative Agenda Phase II program; Using the MICS-DHS micro-data, develop an analytical framework using the socioeconomic, demographic and behavioral variables; and Make a descriptive report with key recommendations based on the analysis for strategic and programming interventions. **Organizational context** Scope of work The Pacific Sub-regional Office, with funding from the Government of Australia, is now embarking on the implementation of its Transformative Agenda (TA), Phase II, which seeks to significantly improve sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR), with a focus on reducing unmet need for family planning in nine (9) countries out of 14 Pacific countries that UNFPA Pacific Sub-Regional Office (PSRO) assists under the new 7th Multi-Country Programme (MCP7) for 2023-2027. Kiribati, Samoa and Vanuatu are three of the countries included in TA program. The TA Phase II establishes a synergistic set of three Outcomes, six Outputs, with contributing strategic interventions, focused on supply, demand and fostering an enabling environment. In TA Phase II, the TA will work to bring more local capacity to the table, including media, communications, and M&E expertise, while broadening engagement at regional and national levels to accelerate the implementation of behaviour change communication (BCC) strategies and plans. This will involve technical support in development of tools, checklists and reporting on M&E activities for BCC interventions, development and dissemination of BCC IEC materials and products and building a country led implementation mechanism with multiple partners. These approaches will focus on annually tracking changes in knowledge and attitudes of women and young people exposed to BCC interventions on SRHR and family planning, and gender-based violence (GBV). Indicator 11 of the TA M&E framework was created to measure these changes in knowledge and attitude over the period of the TA Phase II programme. Framework for the study: The main datasets to be used for these studies are the micro datasets of the 2018-2019 Kiribati Social Development Indicators Survey, 2019 Samoa DHS-MICS, and the 2023 Vanuatu MICS, which are publicly accessible on-line.



	<ul> <li>The focus of the study is on Pacific youth (15 – 24 years of age), women and men (25-49 years of age);</li> <li>The quantitative analysis should be complemented by desk review of existing behavioural change research conducted in the Pacific; and</li> <li>Existing conceptual and theoretical frameworks should guide the consultant's analyses.</li> <li>Within the above framework, the Consultant is expected to undertake the following tasks:         <ol> <li>Construct the composite indicator, as defined by the metadata of the Transformative Agenda monitoring and evaluation (M&amp;E) framework, documenting any limitations placed by the MICS-DHS datasets;</li> <li>Develop an analytical framework using the socio-economic, demographic and behavioural variables contained in the MICS datasets and analyse the composite indicator from a behavioural change perspective;</li> <li>Develop a descriptive report based on the findings from the analysis with key recommendations on how to strengthen proposed strategic and programming interventions.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Participate in meetings with UNFPA/PSRO and implementing partners and stakeholders to update on progress of the work including preparing and making presentations on preliminary results; and</li> <li>Hold a virtual meeting the assigned country to disseminate the results with key national level stakeholders.</li> </ul>
