Title: Consultant for 2024 Key Advocacy Assignments on Population and Development			
Hiring Office:	UNFPA Pacific Sub-Office (PSRO), Suva, Fiji		
Purpose of consultancy:	The consultant will undertake key advocacy assignments in relation to Pacific SIDS engagement in 8 th IPCI, CPD57 for the ICPD+30 review, 4 th SIDS Conference and the Summit of the Future.		
Scope of work: (Organizational context, description of	1. The 8th IPCI - International Parliamentary Conference on the Implementation of ICPD (IPCI/ICPD) will be held on 10-12 April in Oslo, Norway. The ICPD30 review processes will also be part of the 8th IPCI/ICPD. The partnership with Pacific parliamentarians will garner interest and sensitize Champions to further strengthen review of ICPD+30 and advocacy for PSIDS in the 4 th SIDS and Summit of the Future. The scope of work includes power mapping for the region, and tailored approach to engagement and preparations for IPCI/ICPD.		
responsibilities and expected outputs)	2. The 57th CPD (CPD57) – CPD57 will be held from 29th April to 3rd May at the UN Headquarters in New York, USA. The annual intergovernmental meeting will assess the status of implementation of the ICPD POA and its contribution to the follow up and review of the 2030 agenda for Sustainable Development during the decade of action and delivery for sustainable development. The scope of work will include preparatory activities such as: (a) assessment of APPC7 Chair's Summary, (b) engagement with ICPD focal points, (c) regional Pacific preparatory meeting, (d) potential PSIDS side-events, (e) pre-CPD57 briefing for Pacific delegations in New York, (f) engagement of Pacific Missions in Fiji and PSIDS in New York, and (g) support PSIDS in Global Dialogues for ICPD+30.		
	3. 4 th Small Islands Developing States Conference (4 th SIDS) - The scope of work will include preparatory activities such as: (a) mapping of APPC7 Survey against SAMOA Pathway, (b) liaison with SIDS unit in DESA, UNHQ, (c) preparation of advocacy briefs in collaboration with PSRO Technical Advisers; (d) engagement in PREPCOMs, (d) prepare PSIDS side events, (e) support UNFPA Interactive Dialogue in 4 th SIDS.		
	4. Summit of the Future will be convened in UN New York from 22 to 23 September 2024. The Summit will accelerate efforts to meet our existing international commitments and take concrete steps to respond to emerging challenges and opportunities. This will be achieved through an action-oriented outcome document called the Pact for the Future. The Pact will be negotiated and endorsed by countries in the lead-up to and during the Summit in September 2024. The consultancy scope of work is to (a) support PSIDS engagement, (b) preparation of advocacy briefs in collaboration with PSRO Technical Advisers, (c) support PSIDS visibility at the Summit, (d) strategize inclusion of PSIDS APPC7 and ICPD+30 priorities in Pacific Leaders' statements and Pacific joint side-events.

Minimum of 10 years' experience in government foreign ministry and coordination with line ministries, inter-governmental negotiations relevant to Pacific SIDS, representation of PSIDS issues in UN Summit and the sessions of the Commission on Population and Development in NY, and experience with and engagement of high level representation in the Pacific region; Experience working in the UN or other international development organisation is an advantage; Excellent oral and writing skills; excellent project management, reporting skills; Excellent interpersonal skills; culturally, socially sensitive, politically in relation to ICPD and APPC Ministerial Declaration; Ability to work and adapt professionally and effectively in a challenging environment; Solid overall computer literacy, including proficiency in various MS Office applications (Excel, Word, PowerPoint, etc.) and email/internet; and Self-motivated, ability to work with minimum supervision; ability to work with tight deadlines. 	
Inputs/ services to be provided by UNFPA:	UNFPA PSRO Advisers will provide evidence based advocacy briefs, country managers to support country briefings with champions and ICPD focal points, Operations and PMU will support travel and administrative support for PSIDS travel and engagement to the key events listed above.
