Purpose of consultancy:	UNFPA's Pacific Sub-Regional Office (PSRO), located in Fiji, assists 14 Pacific Island Countries and Territories (PICTs) to strengthen national capacity to end maternal death, end unmet need for family planning, and end gender-based violence and harmful practices in both development and humanitarian contexts. The 6th Subregional programme document for Pacific Island countries and territories (CPD 2018-2022) includes strengthening access to quality integrated sexual and reproductive health services for women, adolescents, and youth, across the development humanitarian nexus includes with a specific indicator to ensure that countries can implement Minimum Initial Service Package at the onset of crises. UNFPA Pacific received confirmation of USAID grant (720BHA21IO00233) on 16 August 2021 for the project UNFPA SRHR and GBV Outreach Services: Strengthening continuity of essential SRH and GBV Services During Health Pandemics and Natural Disasters over the period August 20, 2021, to April 17 2023. The goal of the project is to contribute to the reduction of maternal morbidity and mortality including the unmet need for family planning through immediate access to life-saving SRH and GBV services during a crisis. Scope of work:	 In a multi-country office (MCO) operating environment, the SRH in Emergencies Technical Officer will play a vital role in promoting

- She/he will work at the national and sub-national levels to ensure that

 specifically of SRH in emergencies to ensure response and service delivery
 readiness during emergencies.
- She/he will contribute to the coordination and smooth implementation of UNFPA activities in the areas of sexual and reproductive health (SRH) and health sector response to gender based violence (GBV) in emergencies, and provide information on achievement of results in the implementation of this component.
- The SRH Technical Specialist will facilitate and coordinate Implementing Partners, government departments, technical advisers and experts and contribute to UN systems coordination through participation in technical dialogue, documentation and knowledge management of emerging good practices and provision of inputs into joint common system initiatives
- In coordination with relevant partners, provide technical support in the implementation of SRH telehealth and Women Friendly Spaces and Outreach services at sub-national levels and their integration into national and sub-national processes as part of the humanitarian response through consultations with beneficiary countries.
- Organize with government counterparts relevant to SRH in emergency training including MISP, GBViE, and strategise on its implementation through country consultations.
- Support the convening of regular RH stakeholder meetings to problem solve and strategize the implementation of the MISP, telehealth and to support the development of technical resource materials.
- Liaise with Central Medical Stores to improve the supply chain systems to ensure no stockouts of SRH supplies at health facilities especially during emergencies and pandemics.
- Support the Humanitarian Specialist in providing specifications for RH in emergency related commodities, including RH kits and supporting procurement processes working with the RHCS team and the National Medical Stores of countries.
- Ensure regular communication among all levels and report back on key conclusions and on challenges requiring resolution (e.g., policy or other barriers that restrict the population's access to SRH services in emergencies including in pandemics like COVID 19) or the overall national and sub-national health coordination mechanism. This includes identifying synergies and gaps and avoiding a duplication of efforts and parallel structures.
- Support the roll out of MISP and SRH telehealth implementation and audience-specific orientation sessions when and where feasible (e.g., for service providers, community health workers, program staff and the affected population, including adolescents).
